4: President's Report

It has been an exciting few weeks as we acquired the new hardware which was made possible by the Community Grant from Bendigo Bank and the grant from Perth Airport. The new video camera, microphones, projector and laptops will prove invaluable for making high quality recordings and projecting excellent images at our talks.

The two new laptops will enable us to operate more effectively in the back office and, when connected through new software to the cloud, will allow us all to work with a common set of data. I am really grateful to Sue for her hard work in getting the quotes, researching the various purchasing options and arranging the procurement of this kit.

Discussions with LotteryWest have continued as they helped us refine our grant application - which incidentally we agreed to expand to cover the acquisition of the digital street map of Maylands and touch screen display. A decision is expected by the end of September.

I enjoyed doing the research for the talk that I gave in June on "Changing Faces of Maylands", although it was also a little frustrating not to be able to follow up on all of the local people who were suggested to me. Potentially, there are enough additional stories to fill another talk! More importantly, these people could form part of a programme of oral histories. We will need volunteers to undertake these interviews and then the capacity to edit them for sharing on the website or through individual viewing booths.

At that meeting I also raised the issue of the Maylands Brickworks and, based on the supportive feedback I received from Members, we made a submission to the CoB Councillors on behalf of MHPA. (I also shared, as a private citizen, the concerns that I have.) Although it is clear that the City does not have the resources itself to fund any development of the buildings, I am hopeful that other options may become available. I look forward to representing the interests of MHPA if the Community Reference Group is re-established to explore possible future options.

We are exploring setting up a work-experience placement with a pupil from Bold Park School. I have been doing more planning and preparation for the History Week associated with the Maylands Street Festival in November.
