

Looking back in time.....50 years ago - 22 April 1953

The Maylands Parents and Citizens' Association has asked that land at the foot of Fourth avenue, Maylands, set aside for a delinquent and mental children's home, be utilised instead for recreation purposes. A copy of a letter to the Minister for Health (Mr. Nulsen) containing this request was received by the Perth Road Board yesterday. Supporting this view, Mr. W. P. S. Bardon said that May lands was "very short" of playing fields and immediate action was necessary to secure this area for future recreation purposes. It was decided to notify the association that the board was seeking a deputation to Mr. Nulsen on the matter. It was suggested that representatives of the association join the board in its approach.
